Louise Chelsey Bursary

Louise Chesley began her gymnastics career at Delbrook High School (North Vancouver) in 1958. She would go on to become BC Champion, an Olympian in Rome 1960, and a silver medalist at the 1962 Pan American Games in Texas. She founded the Flicka Gymnastics Club in North Vancouver. After graduating from UBC in 1965 as Valedictorian, Louise became the PE Department Head at Aldergrove Community Secondary School – a position she maintained until her retirement in 1999.

In the early years, after running a recreational gymnastics and trampoline club, Louise's athletes began to compete and achieved regional, Western Canadian and National results. When Charlie Nash restored BC High School competitions in 1981, Louise again took up the challenge. Annually, she organized the Langley District, Upper Fraser Valley, and on occasion, the Fraser Valley competitions. Each year, the girls and boys Aldergrove teams qualified for the BC Finals and proved to be strong contenders, winning many awards.

Louise was also a long standing member of the BCSSGA Board of Directors as well as on the Fraser Valley Executive. She was acknowledged as one of the first recipients of the BC Sports "Lifetime Achievement Sports Award." However, the achievement that she most cherished was the naming of the Aldergrove School Gymnastics Gym in her honour, where a plaque is there today that recognizes her 33 years of dedication to her athletes. There is also a \$900 scholarship in her name that continues to be awarded to a student recognizing their community or school sports involvement.

Apart from all the awards and accolades, Louise's philosophy never wavered. Winning was good but personal achievement of the athletes was paramount. She never turned away an enthusiast, no matter how challenged, and she always encouraged each individual to be the best they could be – athletically, academically, and more importantly, in the pursuit of a positive lifestyle that many had never before envisioned. Because of her legacy, Aldergrove gymnasts have become better people and a tribute to her complete coaching/mentoring system. They will remember her and she will be missed. This bursary in her name is a memorial to the epitome of gymnastics excellence. To all destined to emulate Louise Chesley's example: "Follow your dreams".

The BCSSGA is proud to provide two \$250 bursaries to deserving student-athletes in grade 12.
