## **DAY 1: TRUSTING GOD IN THE SILENCE**

**Scripture:** Luke 24:1–2 (NKJV)

### **Devotional Thought:**

Saturday represents the tension between promise and fulfillment. The women came to the tomb expecting death, not realizing God had already begun the work of Resurrection. Silence does not mean inactivity. God is always working behind what we cannot see.

### **Family Reflection Questions:**

1. Have you ever experienced a season where God felt silent? What did it feel like?
2. What helps you trust God when you cannot see immediate results?
3. How can our Family encourage one another during “silent seasons”?

### **Family Prayer:**

Heavenly Father, teach us to trust You even when we cannot hear You. Strengthen our faith in seasons of waiting, and remind us that You are always at work. In Jesus’ name, Amen.

### **Family Action Step:**

Share one current challenge each family member is facing and commit to praying daily for one another this week.

## **DAY 2: GOD IS WORKING BEHIND THE STONE**

**Scripture:** Isaiah 55:8–9 (NKJV)

### **Devotional Thought:**

While the world saw a sealed tomb, God was dismantling death itself. What appears final to us is often just the beginning of God’s greater plan. The stone is never an obstacle to God—it is an opportunity for revelation.

### **Family Reflection Questions:**

1. What “stone” in your life feels impossible to move right now?
2. How does knowing God works behind the scenes change your perspective?
3. What past situation shows that God was working even when you couldn’t see it?

### **Family Prayer:**

Lord, help us to trust Your unseen work. When obstacles appear overwhelming, remind us that You have already gone before us. Strengthen our faith in Your divine plan. Amen.

### **Family Action Step:**

Write down one “impossible situation” and place it somewhere visible as a reminder to trust God daily.

## DAY 3: EXPECTING DIVINE SURPRISE

Scripture: Ephesians 3:20 (NKJV)

### Devotional Thought:

The women expected a sealed grave but encountered an empty tomb. God does not merely meet expectations—He exceeds them. The Resurrection reveals that God specializes in doing the unexpected.

### Family Reflection Questions:

1. Have you ever experienced a blessing you did not expect?
2. Why do we sometimes limit what we believe God can do?
3. How can we grow in expecting God to move in powerful ways?

### Family Prayer:

Father, expand our faith beyond our expectations. Help us to trust that You are able to do exceedingly and abundantly above all we ask or think. In Jesus' name, Amen.

### Family Action Step:

Each family member shares one thing they are believing God for—and Speak-it aloud in faith together.

## **DAY 4: VICTORY OVER SIN AND DEATH**

**Scripture:** 1 Corinthians 15:55–57 (NKJV)

### **Devotional Thought:**

The Resurrection is not merely an event—it is a declaration of victory. Sin has been defeated. Death has lost its sting. Through Christ, we are no longer bound—we are free.

### **Family Reflection Questions:**

1. What does victory in Christ mean personally to you?
2. How does the Resurrection change the way we view fear and death?
3. In what areas of your life do you need to walk in greater victory?

### **Family Prayer:**

Lord Jesus, thank You for the victory You secured on the Cross and through the Resurrection. Help us to live as people who are free, forgiven, and victorious. Amen.

### **Family Action Step:**

Encourage each family member to declare aloud: “I have Victory through Jesus Christ.”

## DAY 5: FROM SILENCE TO SHOUT

Scripture: Psalm 47:1 (NKJV)

### Devotional Thought:

The proper response to the Resurrection Victory is Praise. What began in silence must end in a shout. When we truly understand what Christ has done, we cannot remain quiet.

### Family Reflection Questions:

1. What has God done in your life that deserves Praise?
2. Why is Praise an important response to God's work?
3. How can our Family make Praise a daily lifestyle?

### Family Prayer:

Father, we thank You for the victory of the Resurrection. Fill our hearts with gratitude and our mouths with Praise. Let our lives reflect Your glory. Amen.

### Family Action Step:

Spend time together in Praise—sing a song, read a psalm aloud, or simply thank God as a family.

## **CLOSING**

**May the God of Resurrection power strengthen your  
faith in Seasons of Silence,  
Surprise you with His divine intervention,  
And fill your home with Victorious Praise.**

**May your Family walk in the assurance that the stone  
has been rolled away,  
The grave has been defeated,  
And the victory has already been secured.**

**Go forth—not in fear, but in faith.
